WHO WE ARE

YOUR PRIVACY

Everyone has rights with regard to the way in which their personal data is handled. During our activities, we will collect, store and process personal data about our course members and other third parties, and we recognise that the correct and lawful treatment of this data will maintain confidence in the organisation and will provide for successful operations.

Your personal data, which may be held on paper or on a computer or other media, is subject to certain legal safeguards specified in the General Data Protection Regulation and equivalent EU regulations.

This policy and any other documents referred to in it, sets out the basis on which we will process any personal data we collect from you or that is provided to us by yourself or other sources. This policy sets out rules on data protection and the legal conditions that must be satisfied when we obtain, handle, process, transfer and store personal data.

HOW DO WE COLLECT PERSONAL INFORMATION?

We collect personal information about you when you interact with us for example when you visit our website to send us a course application form or send us a financial donation.

WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT?

Personal information we collect about you may include your name, postal address, email address, phone numbers and date of birth. We do not collect "sensitive personal data" about you such as ethnicity.

We may also collect information about how our website is used and track which pages users visit. We use this information to monitor and improve our website. Where possible we use anonymous or aggregated data that does not identify individuals. See further information about cookies below.

HOW DO WE USE PERSONAL INFORMATION?

We use the personal information collected from you to process course application forms and any donations.

DO WE PROVIDE INFORMATION TO OTHER PARTIES?

We will never sell your data to any third party nor will we share your details with other entities for marketing purposes.

We will only share information with other organisations where we have your specific permission to do so in accordance with this Privacy Policy or where it is necessary for a legitimate reason connected with the services we offer, or where it is required by law or regulation.

DATA SECURITY

The ISC is committed to keeping your personal information safe and secure and we have security policies and technical measures in place to help protect your information.

We will put in place procedures and technologies to maintain the security of all personal data from the point of collection to the point of destruction.

All our employees are obliged to comply with our strict information security procedures.

WHERE YOUR DATA IS HELD

Your personal data is held on secure servers and we do not transfer your data outside the EEA.

COOKIES

We use these to improve our users' experience of our website, temporarily store data and understand the parts of the website that users are visiting. A cookie will help us gather statistics on the use of our website anonymously. You can set your browser to not accept cookies, but this may affect the functionality of the website.
